		The Council received comments from resident(s) present.

	D	a. Village Maintenance Group
		Email from the clerk requesting the planters to be done for the summer has been
		received and passed to a colleague who will respond. It was noted that a planter at
		the far East end of the village (next to the Wheldrake brick sign) had not been
		planted up. Felt that it was not in an optimal position and the possibility of moving it
		should be considered – eg to the junction of Beck Lane with Church Lane.
		Email from resident in respect of overgrowing verges encroaching on pathways on Main Street and Church Lane – noted that majority of residents actually trim those
		outside their properties. Cllr Southern to contact TJ to sort.
		b. Playpark Committee
		No immediate concerns and things seem to have quietened down in spite of lighter
		nights.
		Councillor Southern gave feedback on her attendance at a playpark inspection
		training session. It is clear that we fall short in many areas – eg provision of self-
		closing gates, weekly inspections, activity logs etc. The clerk will contact YLCA who
		provided the course to get the information required so the PC can put things in place.
